## **36-HOUR SEAFOOD MARATHON RETURNS TO SYDNEY FISH MARKET THIS CHRISTMAS**

For more than twenty years, locals, tourists and Aussies from far and wide have participated in the Christmas tradition of the 36-Hour Seafood Marathon. Over 100,000 visitors are expected to visit Sydney Fish Market during the Marathon to source the freshest and tastiest seafood for the hotly anticipated family Christmas barbie.

This year, 700 tonnes of fresh seafood is expected to be traded – the equivalent weight to 350,000 Christmas trees. There is plenty of time for everyone to come down and choose their Christmas seafood feast, with the 36 hours of continual trading from 5:00am on Friday, 23 December, all the way through to 5:00pm on Saturday, 24 December.

It is expected that more than 200 tonnes of prawns, and 900,000 oysters will be sold over the 36 hours.

Sydney Fish Market General Manager, Bryan Skepper, says, “The 36-Hour Seafood Marathon is a long-standing tradition for us. Visitors can expect a colourful and exciting atmosphere throughout the 36 hours – it is a great opportunity for everyone to enjoy the buzz of the marathon, stock up on Christmas supplies and enjoy some delicious seafood on the boardwalk”.

Sydney Fish Market is a foodie’s haven; a one-stop shop for all Christmas supplies. It is known as the place where the city meets the sea boasting an incredible range of seafood from the site’s six wet fish retailers as well as restaurants and cafes.

But it’s not just about seafood at Sydney Fish Market, shoppers can also grab a Christmas turkey or a rare-breed Kurobuta Ham from the butcher; get advice on the best wines and beer for pairing with their meal from the bottle shop; or pick up fresh bread from the bakery. To complete the Christmas feast, there is also a wide choice of deli items including cold meats, olives and cheeses from the deli, and fresh fruit and vegetables from the greengrocer.

There will also be a special appearance from Santa Claus on Friday 23<sup>rd</sup> and Saturday 24<sup>th</sup> from 11:00am to 1:00pm to bring even more Christmas spirit to the 36-Hour Seafood Marathon.
